Quartz	Influenza (age 6 months & older); zoster (Shingrix) (age 50 & older); and the following for 18 and older: pneumococcal; tetanus diphtheria; and tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis. WEA	All ACIP-recommended vaccines for all ages are covered to be administered in a pharmacy	Half of WEA membership has this health and drug coverage. The other half has WEA health coverage and Navitus as their drug coverage so this doesn't apply to them.
WPS	Generally, all ACIP-recommended vaccines for all ages are covered to be administered in a pharmacy, with the caveat that a minority of insurance products may have their own unique limitations. If a vaccine claim adjudicates, the pharmacy can be assured it's covered.

<u>Medicaid (Age 6-18 yo)</u>	All vaccines recommended by the Advisory Committee for Immunization Practices (ACIP) and approved by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)	If an allowable vaccine is available through the VFC Program, Wisconsin Medicaid will reimburse only a \$15.00 administration fee to the pharmacy. For allowable vaccines that are not available through the VFC Program, Wisconsin Medicaid reimbursement will include an amount for the vaccine plus a \$15.00 administration fee. Must be enrolled in VFC Program.

Medicare Part D	All immunizations not covered by Medicare part B, including: Tdap, Zoster, Varicella, Hepatitis B are covered to be administered in a pharmacy.
